ADVENT – A TIME OF PREPARATION FOR FAMILIES

Advent is a time of preparation——a time for us to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Savior. Our lives are so busy, but it is the perfect time for families to slow down, just a little bit, to focus on the true meaning of the season! Enjoy the following as a part of your Advent preparation. Advent reminds us of the mystery of the Virgin birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. The season of Advent marks the beginning of the Church Year for Christians all over the world. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve (Dec 24). During Advent, we prepare our hearts for the mystery of the incarnation by focusing on the Virgin Birth and the faith of the virgin Mary, the shepherds, and the wise men.

In particular, Advent is a time to join together with others to celebrate the coming of Christ's birth. It can also be a wonderful time to celebrate your faith together as a family. Families have learned the joy of celebrating Advent with their children. You can also follow the season with your children with meaningful traditions that include Bible readings, prayers, and crafts.

Advent Wreath

Many Christian families use an Advent wreath to celebrate the themes of Advent in the home. The Advent wreath is rich in symbolism and is typically an evergreen wreath that contains five candles that retells the Christmas story. The circle of greenery reminds us that God is eternal, the Alpha and Omega without beginning or end. The candles symbolize the light of God entering the world through the birth of Jesus. The four outer candles represent a period of waiting for the birth of Jesus and their light reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world that comes into the darkness of our world. They

also remind us that we are called to be a light to the world as we reflect the light of God's love and grace to others. The themes most often used for the four weeks of Advent are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. However, the choice of themes is not limited to these exclusively. The candles have different colors that remind us of the themes for Advent. Traditionally the primary color of Lent is purple, which reflects fasting that formed part of the build-up to Christmas in earlier centuries. The color purple also reminds us of the link between the birth and death of Jesus. On the third Sunday of Advent the color changes to pink or rose in anticipation of the end of the birth of lesus Christ. The center candle is white and is called the Christ Candle. It is traditionally lit on Christmas Eve or Day where there is a service on these days. Your family can make your own Advent wreath or you can buy one from your local Christian bookstore. You can gather around your family dinner table on Sunday evenings and light a candle, read a portion of scripture, and say a prayer each Sunday in Advent. Here is a list of prayers and verses to go with each theme.

First Sunday: Hope

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. Isaiah 9:2 One purple candle is lit.

"Almighty God, as the Advent season begins, we cry out to you in hope. In a world of darkness and death our only hope is in you. Wherever we find ourselves this season, Loving God, remind us that our hope is in you. Be with us on this Advent journey. Amen."

Second Sunday: Love

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13:34-35

Two purple candles are lit.

your only Son Jesus Christ live and die for us. We pray that you remind us this week of your love for us and that we may share your love with others. Let us live in the reality of your free and eternal love. Amen."

Third Sunday: Joy

But be glad and rejoice forever in what I will create, for I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people a joy. Isaiah 65:18 Two purple candles and one pink candle are lit. "Dear Jesus, you came to bring us joy. Help us to not to find our joy in the things of this world, but in you and your Kingdom. This week in our Advent journey, open our eyes to the joy that surrounds us. Amen."

Fourth Sunday: Peace

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this. Isaiah 9:6-7 Three purple candles and the pink candle are lit.

"Dear Jesus, we pray that you would reveal yourself to us today as the Prince of Peace. We need peace in our lives, our homes, our families, our church, and our whole world. Help us to slow down and seek out the peace that only you provide, that we may become peacemakers for others. Amen."

Christmas Eve/Day

While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping "Dear God, you loved us so much that you sent watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. Luke 2:6-11

All five candles are lit.

"We have been waiting for this day, Jesus Christ, Son of God. On this Christmas Day, we pray that you would help us live as those who let hope, peace, joy, and love reign in our lives, our families, our home, and our world. As the candles burns brightly and light our home, let us live as those who have the Christ's light burning inside us today and everyday. Amen."

MINUTES FROM THE IMPACT THE WORLD BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 16, 2023

Members present: Marcia Heinje, Sue DeJong, Linda Anderson, Gloria Cooley, Vicki Strege and Pastor Melanie

The meeting opened with a Zoom meeting with Jordan and Lexi Hins from Istanbul, Turkey. Jordan, the son of Kirby and Rita Hins of Milbank, and his wife, Lexi, introduced themselves and explained about their mission work. They are associated with the Cru Ministries and reaching out to the college aged community in Turkey. The main religion in Turkey is Islam and Muslim. There are very few Christians in Turkey, and they are reaching out to young people to introduce them to the love and mercy of Christ. Our church is designating the December Noisy Change offering to their ministry. Jordan is not given any financial support other than what he raises through donations to his ministry. Jordan and Lexi will have a YouTube presentation for us at the December 3 worship service to share information about their mission work in Istanbul. We are pleased to have a "hometown boy" as a recipient of our Noisy Change Offering.

Linda made a motion that was seconded by Vicki to have a weekly announcement in the Sunday bulletin reminding us of the mission of the month so as to keep this mission opportunity in the minds and hearts of the parishioners. Motion passed.

Kelly Peterson was present at the meeting to give the board members a better understanding of the financial system used at LWLC.

Financial Statement: \$9,723.94 is the balance on hand as of November 2023.

Pastor Melanie was asked to explain the details of the Vietnam Mission Trip to the congregation on November 19th.

It was noted that there is at this time \$3,371 available for the mission trip to Vietnam.

Sue made a motion that was seconded by Gloria to hold a rummage sale in April to raise funds for the mission trip to Vietnam. Motion passed.

Marcia made a motion that was seconded by Sue to take up to \$300 from the Impact the World budget to purchase craft items from a merchant in Israel to sell in our church to raise money for the Vietnam Mission Trip. Motion passed.

The ITW board is working on a plan to change the percentages of the Benevolence Quarterly Contributions to include Jordan Hin's mission in Turkey. We are proposing to ask the council to decrease the Grand County Food Pantry and the Big Stone-Ortonville Food pantry to 8% each and Call to Freedom to 5% so as to be able to put Jordan Hins on the Benevolence Quarterly Contribution List at 5%. This will be presented at the December council meeting.

A motion was made by Linda and seconded by Marcia to designate the contributions for the Advent and Lenten meals for the Vietnam trip. Motion passed.

Sue made a motion that was seconded by Linda to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed.

The next meeting will be held on January 11, at 1:30 pm.

PASTOR'S LETTER

THE SEASON OF ADVENT

Hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Romans 8:24-25

Dear Church family of Living Word:

The word Advent means "coming." It is the season of the Church year where we are reminded of the reality of Christ's coming into our world. It is a season of preparation and anticipation, not simply for the celebration of Christmas, but to recognize that hope and expectation are a part of our daily life of faith.

When writing on the subject of Advent, Martin Luther spoke of three different "comings" of Christ:

The **first** coming was indeed when Christ was born as a child in Bethlehem---his coming in the past. The first advent was when the eternal Son of God took on human flesh and became a living part of our world.

As Christians, we also believe in the **second** coming of Christ---his coming in the future. At the end of all time, Christ will return to bring his kingdom to fulfillment. On that day he will raise us up to appear before his throne of judgment.

The **third** coming of Christ of which Luther spoke has no single particular time attached to it, so it is perhaps better to put no number to it all. This other coming of Christ does not occur with portents in the heavens, no choirs of angels on high. It is an advent that is hard to see at all, because it happens through the Spirit of God. This is Christ's coming into the present, when our Lord enters into the hearts of everyday people in the here and now, through his Word, in faith.

Of the three, this may be the single most important Advent of Christ, at least as far as our salvation is concerned. Because it is only through the advent of



faith that the first and second comings of Christ take on meaning for us as individuals. It is when Christ enters our hearts that his presence became a reality for each of us in our lives, and we recognize all the many ways that God is truly with us. (....from Looking to the Manger by Rev. Kristopher Madsen)

Our recent Lectionary readings over the past few Sundays have spoken to the preparation we must make for the coming of Christ into the world, not just in the celebration of His birth, but most importantly, our preparation for his second coming. This preparation takes place I our hearts as Luther said, when the first and second comings become real to us and we receive the assurance of our salvation and eternal life with our Savior when this world comes to an end.

In this season of preparation this year, let us be more mindful than ever of Christ's coming looking to the manger in a deeper way than ever before. May you have a most Blessed Christmas and a New Year of love and happiness.
