MISSION BOARD REPORT

uring the month of November, we began our mission project to help Michael Sanchez, evangelist and church planter from Clark, SD, with his mission work of sharing the good news of salvation with Hispanic dairy workers throughout eastern South Dakota. Pastor Sanchez presently lives in Clark, SD and in order to help them more effectively he needs to move from Clark to Bryant, SD where his church, Gospel of Fire of Bryant, is located. There was no housing to be purchased in Bryant, so he bought a house for \$8,500 in Arlington. It cost \$23,000 to move it to Bryant and he needs to add an addition to the main floor and a basement for a total of approximately \$120,000. Not only will he and his family live there, he hopes to provide temporary lodging for immigrants and fellow missionaries as they establish themselves in the community. Pastor Sanchez receives no financial help from his churches that he establishes, he supports himself by doing construction work and teaching martial art classes in addition to his mission duties.

Our mission project to help Pastor Sanchez was very successful. We donated \$9,050 to support his work. The LWLC Mission Board is amazed, awed and so proud of the financial generosity our church as given. As Paul said to Timothy in 1Tim 6: 17-18 "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life."

The board thanks you from the bottom of our hearts for your support with this project. We have a couple more projects that we will introduce in 2023 that will offer you the opportunity to share your blessings with others. We also want to remind you to give to those projects out of your generosity that speak to you because you feel called to do so, not because you have to.

The LWLW **GENERAL MEETING** that was scheduled



DEAR CHURCH FAMILY OF LIVING WORD LUTHERAN CHURCH,

Happy New Year! As I write this, we are still "enjoying" the blizzard which just may be ending by Christmas Eve. Nonetheless, we are welcoming a New Year with all the promise it holds — all because of Jesus coming into the world as our Savior!

Christian theologian, C.S. Lewis once said that "Christianity is a religion that you could not have guessed. It is not the sort of thing that anyone would. That the Almighty would humble Himself and become a human being in order to suffer and die on a cross to bring new life to His own creation, well who would have thought it? How odd of God." Having just come through the Advent season and the celebration of Christmas, we too, have to be amazed, once again, that God would humble Himself to send us a Savior.

Yet, it is here that Christians are distinct from other religions
