

ASCENSION DAY

DEAR CHURCH FAMILY OF LIVING WORD LUTHERAN CHURCH:

Holy Week, and Easter — the celebration of the resurrection of Christ from the grave! His victory over sin and death is the greatest

thing we can ever celebrate; and, we should celebrate it every day! As we look to May, we will complete the Sundays of Easter in our Lectionary. As our Church year continues, we come to Ascension Day on May 18 and celebrate it in our churches the following Sunday — it is one of those events that doesn't get a great deal of

attention.

Ascension Day/Sunday holds a special place in the Easter celebration of Christian churches around the world. When we confess our faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed, we proclaim our belief in the Ascension in the same breath we proclaim Christ died and was raised again from the dead: "On the

third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead." Each time we utter the words of the Apostles' Creed, we are celebrating life-saving events that proclaim God's power for life and God's willingness to intervene in amazing ways on behalf of the world God created

and loves. The
Ascension of the Lord
is a significant part of
the Easter story and
another testimony
to God's resurrection
power. Just as Christ
was "lifted up" on
the cross, he is again
"lifted up" from the
grave, and yet, again,
"lifted up" to God's
right hand.

As you go through the month of May, it is my prayer that each day is Easter for you and

that you continue to be "lifted up" spiritually as you are reminded of the "lifting up" of Christ for you — the Cross, the grave, and in his return to the Father.
