



Now, we are beginning our **Easter Lego curriculum**, where we will:


- Learn to pray like Jesus

Pastor's Letter

Grace, Mercy, and Peace, be unto you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

As we draw closer to Easter Sunday, we often feel the sting of our guilt as the cross draws closer for Christ. The unimaginable pain and suffering our Savior endured on the cross is a yearly reminder that our sin is what killed Him. Our hardened and blackened hearts do not want to be told what to do. We want to be our own boss, in control of our own destiny, and our own God. And the truth of the matter is, that without the Holy Spirit, we would not even know our own sin much less who Christ is.

When Christ sent the Holy Spirit to us, it wasn't to "watch over us" or to "comfort us". The Holy Spirit was sent to call, gather, and enlighten all of God's people. Luther says, "In Baptism, the Holy Spirit works faith and so creates in us new spiritual life with the power to overcome sin." It is the Holy Spirit who brings us to faith and allows us to hear and believe in the Word of God. It is the Holy Spirit that sanctifies us, forgives us, and renews us daily when we repent in prayer.

We are baptized daily through repenting for our sins. God's promise is renewed every time we ask for forgiveness. The Old Adam is put to death, and the New Adam, full of the Holy Spirit, strong in faith, and righteous before God, is reborn. In our prayers we do not have to be specific because God already knows your sins. What He is looking for in your prayers is a contrite heart, a faithful spirit, and the proclamation of His glory and His mercy.

After all, our Lord and Savior is on His way to the cross to die for you. He is heading to defeat death and the devil once and for all. He is on His way to fulfill God's Law so that those of us who are sinful and do not keep the law, through faith in Him, we may be granted access into His kingdom. Not because of anything we have done, but because He has chosen to grant us forgiveness according to His boundless mercy.

This Easter, set your gaze upon God's love and compassion for you. Center your focus on His love and mercy. Remember the promise of salvation found in your baptism, and know that God has prepared a place for you in His kingdom, through Christ Jesus our Lord.

A Message from our Council President

Greetings everyone,

On Sunday, March 23, congregational members stayed after church to vote on whether or not they wanted to continue the process of our proposed building project. The results were: 83 in favor of continuing to move forward in the process, understanding that the next step would be a pledge drive and an assessment of the financial requirements needed; 21 voted to not continue pursuing the proposed building project at this time; and 2 abstained Thank you to everyone who has been involved and participating through conversations, questions, and praying!!

Since the results of the vote were in favor of taking the next step, the Church Council held a special meeting to plan a pledge drive. Members of our congregation will be getting a letter in the mail in which a pledge form will be included. We ask that you to prayerfully consider what God is laying on your heart for this project. Once you have filled out the pledge sheet, you can either mail it back to the church or leave it in a drop off box that will be placed in the back of the church. This pledge, should we move forward with the project, will then become a commitment. Thank you for prayerfully considering how God is leading you to give. Whether it is monetary (of any amount), support through fervent prayer, and/or a willingness to share your time and talent, please know that you are appreciated and an important part of this church family!

Last night when I walked into that special Church Council meeting, someone asked me about the sweatshirt I was wearing. I looked down at it, as if I couldn't remember what I put on that morning, and he asked me about what was printed on it. "What does 'Even if... Daniel 3:8' mean?" Knowing that the meeting was about to start, I gave a quick 10 second explanation of what that verse meant to me.

The next morning, in my quiet time, I picked up my bible and it just so happened to open up to Daniel. I thought "OK God, I'll look up that verse." Here's a recap: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were thrown into a fiery furnace because they refused to obey King Nebuchadnezzar who decreed everyone to bow down and worship a gold statue and serve his gods. The King taunted the three men, "What god will be able to rescue you from my power?" Part of their response can be found in vs 17-18. "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God whom we serve is able to save us. He will rescue us from your power, Your Majesty. But **even if** he doesn't, we want to make it clear to you, Your Majesty, that we will never serve your gods or worship the gold statue you have set up." I immediately had the realization that I believe this verse is relevant to right now. The God whom we serve is able to provide for this building project. But even if he doesn't, we will faithfully serve Him and we will worship Him, and only Him.

The God whom we serve is able...

He will.....

But even if he doesn't.... We will.....

Although our opinions on church projects, programs, activities etc may differ from one another, let us remember our commonality. We are united by our common belief in a Triune God, the inherent Word of God, and our love for Jesus who died for our sins. We will faithfully serve Him. Thank you for continuing to pray for our church family as we move forward in faith, trusting God to lead us.

OPENING: Jackie gave the opening prayer.

GUEST SPEAKER: Angel Campbell gave a presentation on NA (Narcotics Anonymous). Moe made a motion to approve NA meetings to take place at LWLC on Tuesday evenings from 7-8 p.m. year round. If there are conflicts with LWLC schedule, arrangements will be made for NA to take place at another location for that eveing. Laurie seconded the motion. The motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: Moe made a motion to approve the agenda, which was seconded by Sandy. The motion carried.

The Pastors' visits at hospital/nursing home/homes are continuing to go well. Confirmation classes have been completed. A date will be set for confirmation Sunday in the near future. Pastor feels Lenten services are going well. Pastor's schedule was discussed with Mondays being his day off. Deb made a motion to approve the Pastor's report. Moe seconded the motion, and the motion was carried.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT REPORT: A new vacuum was purchased. Jackie made a motion for the church to purchase Lutheran Services Builder software for the office. Sandy seconded that motion. The motion carried. A light fixture was replaced a few weeks ago, and there was a discussion regarding replacing additional lights at some point. Julie made a motion to approve the report. Moe seconded the motion, and the motion carried.



It is open to congregation members and allows them to invite a guest. Money to help fund this event can be accessed through the Barland Fund. Deb made a motion to approve the report. Moe seconded and the motion carried.

YOUTH & EDUCATION REPORT: There will be a sign-up sheet available for families to serve for the Easter breakfast. An Easter egg hunt is being planned. Things are gearing up for VBS, which is scheduled for June 1-5, 2025. Adam made a motion to approve the report. Sandy seconded the motion. The motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: The church directory went to print around February 27. Craig advised that it usually takes 2-3 weeks to complete. An update was given on church apparel for congregation purchase and designs are under way.

NEW BUSINESS: Donations received from Wednesday night Lenten suppers are to be divided equally between the Mission Board and the LWLC Cancer Walk team. A list of names is being compiled for substitutes for the office when Michelle is on vacation. Kelly Peterson is resigning as business manager and efforts are being made to find a replacement. Kelly will continue working with us until we can find someone. Beginning May 4, 2025, we will be going back to passing the offering plate during services. We will be increasing the credit limit on the office credit card, and discussion was had regarding getting a credit card for the pastor. A pledge drive will be discussed at a special meeting after the March 23 congregational meeting, if the vote passes to proceed with the building project contingent on funding.

The Story Behind Our Church Logo

Living Word Lutheran Church has come a long way since its early days as the "Strip Mall" church in 2010. In September 2011, the congregation took a significant step by voting to ratify a constitution and accepting a generous gift of five acres to build a new church home. After years of prayer and dedication, we moved into our new building on March 20, 2014, and held our first service there on March 23, 2014.

Our church name served as the inspiration for our logo, a meaningful design that reflects our faith and mission. With the help of congregation members, Nancy Kruger thoughtfully designed the **LWLC logo**, ensuring that every element carried a deeper meaning:

- The Bible holds a central place, symbolizing our strong belief in a faith rooted in God's Word.
- The Cross reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice and the eternal life we have through Him.
- Green represents growth and renewal, a testament to how God continually transforms us.
- Brown signifies the earth, God's connection to humanity, and the dust from which
 we were created.

This logo is more than an image—it is a **representation of who we are as a church**, committed to sharing the Living Word with the world.
