Population: 7.6 million
 Communist govt since 1975
 Buddhism and Animism: 96%

Christianity: 3%

### LAO EVANGELICAL CHURCH (LEC)

- Started ministry in the early 1990's with only two churches in the Capital city. Only 26 Christians remained.
- In the whole country, less than 15,000 Christians,
  - with less than 150 churches.
- As of now, there are 1,400 churches and house churches in every province all over Laos

### **Growing Church**

- New churches are opened every year
  - Last year alone almost 100 new churches were opened.
- Last year about 43,000 people heard the Gospel,
- People get converted every day;
  - about 10,000 people received Christ
- People baptized every week.
  - Last year about 4,000 got baptized.
- Now over 15,000 Christian in Vientiane
- Christian population in Laos is now about 250,000 people. (from 15,000 in 1990)

# Challenges Facing the LAO EVANGELICAL CHURCH (LEC)

- Many churches in Laos cannot be selfsupporting
- Most pastors are not fully supported.
- Cannot follow up all new believers.
- · Not enough pastors and workers.



### Social & Community Development

- Lao Evangelical Church (LEC) has a major impact on social work and rural development throughout Laos.
- Strengthens good relationship between Church leadership and local authorities.
- Involved with the life of the community through social development programs and services.

### **PASTOR'S LETTER**

St. Peter tells us in 1 Peter 5:7-9:

"7 cast all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. 8 Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 9 Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brother-hood throughout the world.

**OPENING:** Pastor Curtis gave the opening prayer.

**AGENDA APPROVAL:** Several items were added to the agenda. Laurie motioned to approve the agenda and Adam second. Motion carried..

**BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT:** Discussion was had regarding the youth fund money. We need to add the treasurer's name to church accounts. The pastor has received health insurance. The ice machine has been ordered. Moe made a motion to approve the business report and it was seconded by Laurie. Motion carried.

### A Message from our Council President

### Greetings,

First of all, I just want to say how grateful I am to be a part of this church family. There are so many faithful followers of Christ within our congregation, and so many people who are willing to give of their time, talents and resources for our church. I don't even begin to think that I know all of what goes on within our church. Although I know of several people who volunteer and several programs and committees within our church, it's probably only a tip of the iceberg of what really goes on. I may not see, but God sees. And that's ok because Colossians 3:23-24 says: Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.

Decisions, decisions, decisions...it's a part of every committee and of everyday life. Did you know that the average person makes around 35,000 decisions a day? (No wonder I can sometimes feel exhausted and it's not even lunchtime yet!) Some decisions are small, some big; some easy, some take more careful thought. Many take prayer. But what if God is asking us to step back and have a bigger perspective? What if we could have an aerial view, seeing and knowing everything that is involved, everything that is effected by that decision, and how that little piece of the puzzle fits into a bigger plan? Well, God sees it all. He is omnipotent (all-powerful), omniscient (all-knowing), omnipresent (present everywhere at all times). He has a plan and He is guiding us along the best pathway. James 1:5 tells us: If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. (Look this one up and keep reading! There's more to the story, but I'm running out of room. Ha)
