
We fished for about 4 hours and during that time we managed a few bites and one fisherman said he had a fish on his line for a brief time.



### **IMPACT MISSIONS**

### NOISY CHANGE OFFERING FOR JANUARY 2025

As we began another year of God's blessings in our lives, our Noisy Change collection for the first month of the new year was for water filtration systems in Vietnam. I was able to see first hand how the filtration systems changed the lives of the many people who live in the countryside of Vietnam. Without these systems people would have to travel a distance get dirty water from the streams and waterways and boil it thoroughly to make it fit to drink. We just turn on the tap and expect clean healthy water to flow. Not so in many rural areas of

Vietnam. Contaminated water in Vietnam is responsible for 80% of the illnesses in the country. There are many cases of cholera, typhoid, dysentery and malaria. With that being said, the Impact the World board decided to allocate the January Noisy Change collection to help with this problem. Each water filtration system costs around \$1100. These systems are most often installed at the local churches so that people can go there for clean and safe water for consumption and for the Living Water that Jesus so freely offers those who follow Him. I personally believe that this is one of the most important and safest mission projects that one can contribute to. We know when we give to ALWM, Pastor Bill Moberly's mission organization, that the money that is given for these systems will have 100% of the funds going directly to the water project. Now that we have collected \$3,355.32 in January 2025 a check will be written to Pastor Moberly. He will send a safe money order to Van, his chief of operations, in Vietnam. Van knows the places that are allowed to have water filtration systems by the

Vietnamese government. He also know the best prices and people to install these systems. He oversees the project to completion and continues to check on the projects after installation to be sure all is in proper working order. So any time you are looking for a safe and necessary project to donate to, I would highly suggest that you consider water filtration systems, not just in Vietnam, as many other countries have the same need.

Many thanks to everyone who contributed to this project in January. You have made a big difference in the lives of the people in rural Vietnam. May God richly bless you for your love and generosity.

In this letter I wanted to remind everyone of the upcoming meetings regarding the proposed building project so I decided to add a picture to this page. As I added the picture, I noticed something really stood out. The cross. The cross stands far above anything else, far above the new building, and that was a simple reminder that Jesus is still the focus and we want Jesus to be glorified above all else.

Thank you to everyone who has attended the Q & A sessions and to everyone who has looked at the proposal and has inquired about it. And thank you to everyone who has and continues to pray about this! There will be one last meeting this Sunday, March 2, after church to discuss the building project. Scott and Dale have received more information from the architect and will present it at that time. I hope everyone plans to stay so that you can asks questions and be informed.

The next step will be a special Congregational Meeting on March 23, immediately after the service. At this time, the congregation will vote either "yes" to proceed with this proposed building project or "no", not to. Should the vote pass, which tells us there is a desire to add on, then the next step would be a pledge drive. We do have some money in a dedicated account, but a pledge drive would be necessary to help determine if a loan is needed (or if one can be obtained). This process will determine if we have the financial commitment and ability to add on. All of this is our "human plans" - the steps we are prayerfully taking. But we also continually look to God for wisdom, guidance, provision and that our hearts are aligned with His will for our church. Please continue to pray!

And remember, above all, Jesus is still the focus.
