

### LWLC COUNCIL MEETING REPORT - JUNE 11, 2025

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** President Jackie Olson, Moe Reede, Laurie Maas, Adam McMahon, Steve Strege, Deb Buttke, Sandy Christensen, Tim DeJong and Julie Berger.

**OPENING PRAYER:** Jackie gave the opening prayer.

**APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:** Laurie made a motion to approve the agenda, which was seconded by Moe. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: There is no report as Pastor is on vacation.

COMMUNION ASSISTANTS: Tim will assist for July.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Tim made a motion to correct the May secretary's report. ALWM will be receiving \$1,000 not Bill Moberly. Laurie made a motion to approve the report as corrected. Adam seconded the motion, and it was carried.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT: No report.

**TREASURER'S REPORT/FINANCE REPORT:** Discussion was held regarding if we have sufficient insurance for the church. The council agreed to table the discussion until further information is gathered. Steve made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Moe seconded the motion, and it carried.

### Funding Assistance Available Thanks to Cancer Walk-What It Covers and How to Receive It

Approximately 28 years ago a group of dedicated volunteers set out on a labor of love as they began planning and organizing the first "It Only Takes a Spark" Cancer Walk. Today it has grown into an annual community-wide fundraiser, impacting hundreds of local cancer patients and residents.

Individuals in the greater Grant County area who have received a cancer diagnosis requiring continued care and treatment may fill out an application that is then reviewed by the Cancer Walk Core Committee. Funds provided assist cancer patients for the cost of the following expenses:

- Clinic and hospital bills related to cancer
- Cancer medications
- Gas cards used for transportation to and from cancer treatment
- Lodging costs during out-of-town cancer treatment
- Ostomy treatment
- Dressing and bandages
- Cancer diagnostic procedures

Cancer Walk funds are available to any resident in the greater Grant County area. Applications may be found at the following locations:
