Pastor's Letter

Grace, Mercy, and Peace, from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

Summer is wrapping up and the smell of green grass, autumn air, and popcorn will soon fill the air. You will hear whistles, the cracking of pads, and fans cheering. All these things can only mean one thing......FOOTBALL SEASON IS HERE!

For 47 years I either played or coached football. It was a part of my everyday life. The game of football taught me so many life lessons that are very similar to the lessons we find in the bible. As I watched the F.C.A. football camp last week at Milbank High School, I began to think of how similar my habits as a coach or a player were to my habits as a Christian. While one is simply a meaningless sport, the other is a way to salvation. However, careful attention to practice and habits, can bring victory in both Football and Faith.

There are four basic principles to winning in football and victory found in Christ Jesus. There are four habits everyone who wants to grow as a player or as a child of God can do.

Football

Christian Life

1) Read your playbook every day.

Read the Bible Every Day

How can you know what you're supposed to do, where to go, or how to perform your duties, if you never look at your assignment or what the coach or God wants you to do? Read God's word daily, and let His Word function on you and sharpen your knowledge and faith.

2) Pray Pray

In all things, give thanks to God in heaven who has granted you the blessing of becoming one of His children. He blesses us with talents, skills, and health. Now, you may not preach like a clergyman but you know the Lord's Prayer and that is the best prayer we can find. It doesn't have to be long and drawn out, but spend time in prayer every day with your Savior.

3) Go to Practice

Get to Church

The more we do things, the more we make it a habit. When we go to practice or to church, we are gaining something that benefits us. In sport, practice builds stamina, knowledge, and our mistakes can be corrected. In church, we build faith, we gain knowledge, and our mistakes are corrected by Christ who paid for our mistakes.

4) Witness to others

Witness to others

In all places and at all times, we are to reflect the blessings bestowed upon us by God, and to use our talents to gather His people. Let your play and your life reflect the love and compassion shown to you by God. Thank the Lord and sing His praise, tell everyone what He has done for you! Never be afraid to demonstrate all of the blessings and the love that God grants us, and then go forward and share His abundant love.

Do your best as a Christian to incorporate each one of these four habits into your life and watch how God can transform your faith, and you will develop a relationship with Him greater than anything you could have imagined.

Council Minutes

LWLC COUNCIL MEETING REPORT - JULY 16, 2025

MEMBERS PRESENT: Pastor Curtis Simonson, President Jackie Olson, Moe Reede, Laurie Maas, Steve Strege, Deb Buttke, Sandy Christensen, Tim DeJong and Julie Berger.

OPENING PRAYER: Jackie gave the opening prayer.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: Laurie made a motion to approve the agenda, which was seconded by Moe. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: The pastor gave an overview of past month happenings. He suggested we add a conflict resolution pursuant to Matthew 18 to our bylaws. The pastor also made a request to get pre-approval of posters prior to hanging in the church. Deb made a motion to approve the pastor's report. Steve seconded, and the motion carried.

COMMUNION ASSISTANTS: Tim, Deb and Jackie will assist for August 3.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Laurie made a motion to approve the report. Steve seconded the motion, and it was carried.

BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT: No report.

TREASURER'S REPORT/FINANCE REPORT: Deb indicates that we have sufficient insurance coverage for the church. Steve made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Moe seconded the motion, and it carried.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT REPORT: Adam received an estimate from Brady Krause of \$5,814.88 for updating the lighting to LED. Through an e-mail meeting on June 27, Jackie made a motion to approve the bid with Julie seconding the motion. The motion carried. The switch to LED provides continuity, energy efficiency, a 25% longer lifespan and less maintenance issues which will lead to eventual savings. On July 1, Adam notified the council that the lighting project had been completed. Tim reported on the feasibility of using a Knox Box and also the cost of a security system. The council agreed that both items would not be needed based on what they provided and the costs involved. Julie made a motion to approve the report and Moe seconded. The motion carried.

WORSHIP & EVANGELISM REPORT: Sandy gave an update on the upcoming Cancer Walk fundraiser community event. It is scheduled for about 10 weeks out and more information will follow. Steve made a motion to approve the report and Julie seconded, and the motion carried.

YOUTH & EDUCATION REPORT: Laurie gave a report on events for the coming year. Rally Sunday is set for September 7. Materials for any planned bible studies should be previewed by Pastor prior to ordering. There was discussion regarding using some of the youth money for adding a playground and costs will be researched. Julie made a motion to approve the report. Deb seconded the motion, and it carried.

OLD BUSINESS: Research is being done to determine what computer is needed for the office. Just a reminder – church apparel can still be ordered. Let's show our church spirit and wear them on Rally Sunday!!

NEW BUSINESS: Based on recent scams specifically targeting the council members, the process will begin removing and limiting personal information on our website and bulletins. Anyone needing to contact council members can look in their church directory or call the office for contact information. The council decided we will not be applying for the membership per the LCMC Northern Plains letter we received last month.

DATE OF NEXT MEETING: August 13, 2025, at 6:30 p.m.



IMPACT MISSIONS

7/8/2025 Impact The World Meeting Minutes

Members present were: Pastor Curtis, Vicki Strege, Linda Anderson, Howard Heinje and Sue De Jong.

Vicki opened with prayer and Bible verses from Galatians 6:9-10. "Let us not grow weary in doing good."

Jordan and Lexi Hins joined us and informed us more about CRU ministries, especially in Turkey.

CRU ministers with the Gospel of Jesus Christ in 193 countries and on every continent. Since January and February several team members (15 couples and families) have been forced to leave Turkey by the Turkish government.

One of the couples worked closely with Jordan and Lexi. Though sad and difficult Jordan says that those expelled from Turkey are seeing the blessings as they focus their ministries in other areas of the world, including the USA.

The Hins' are planning to return again next summer and will visit our congregation. They left business cards that may be picked up in our fellowship hall with information on how to reach out to them and CRU ministries.

Jordan and Lexi did inform us that their monthly expenses include \$2000.00 for family health insurance. They are in need of financial help to cover about \$1000.00 of this expense per month. Sue made a motion to increase our quarterly giving to CRU ministries/Hins family from 7% of the Benevolent fund to a higher percentage. Linda seconded the motion. It will proceed to the Church Council.

Gloria will speak to Jeannie at ICAP about needs for a sponsorship for a family for Christmas that our congregation could help support.

Pastor Bill Moberly and his wife, Sally, are coming to Milbank on September 27th and 28th. The Impact board will provide a meal with fellowship on Saturday evening for them. A potluck dinner will be held on Sunday, the 28th following worship for the congregation to be able to visit with the Moberly's. We will celebrate Mission Sunday that day as well!

A motion was made by Linda to send \$500.00 from the Impact Mission fund now through Samaritan's Purse to use for the Texas flood victims and cleanup. The motion was seconded by Sue. Motion carried.

We will plan to also do a Noisy Change in September to help with the flood victims in Texas as the needs are realized.

From the Director Fresh from our Tenth Anniversary, the ministry of ALWM Int'l continues to focus on the least reached focus on the least reached/ unreached, defined as "a people group among which there is no indigenous community of Believing Christians with adequate numbers and resources to evangelize their own people without significant outside assistance". We trust God to provide the "significant outside assistance" our partners need from our network of relationships with churches and individuals across the US. Read on for some highlights, including a major leadership training initiative in partnership with the Int'l Orality Institute. Our goal aligns with theirs: reproducible discipleship! IOI employs an oral style, using the parables and question-and-answer style of teaching that Jesus used! Swapon Sarker (Bangladesh), Pastor Sam (Cambodia), and Pastor Martin (Myanmar) each said "this is what we need!" so ALWM is translating and printing IOI's two years of training materials. Late fall I will bring IOI staff to these countries to train 90+ leaders! I will also join Pastor Sam to lead our third annual ALWM Cambodia Youth Conference! We're thankful to report that the land for the ALWM Cambodia Youth & Ministry Training is paid off with \$20,000+ on hand to build
