



### Pastor's Letter

Grace, Mercy, and Peace, be unto you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

Good communication is important. Getting the right message out is critical toward accomplishing the goal or outcome you have before you. Hello everyone,

### LWLC COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES - AUGUST 13, 2025

MEMBERS PRESENT: Pastor Curtis Simonson, President Jackie Olson, Moe Reede, Laurie Maas, Steve Strege, Deb Buttke, Sandy Christensen and Tim DeJong.

Pastor Curtis opened up with prayer.

### APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor reported Feeding SD went well this past month. This month he has made several pastoral visits to nursing homes, hospice patients, the homebound etc. as well as delivering at-home communion. Rally Sunday is Sept. 7and Mission Sunday is Sept. 28. Pastor was interested in the Council's thoughts about Gideons coming to speak. Consensus was they have been doing fine and we want to continue to have them come. Our church will have a float in the Cornfest parade this coming weekend. New members will be welcomed during the Aug 24 church service. Pastor said he will be doing/teaching MS and HS students for youth education but will also have assistance from congregation members. Notice of Vesper service and chapel communion will be posted in bulletin, announced by Pastor and put in/on the monthly calendar. Pastor is going to talk to the seminary school regarding their recommendation on how best to handle privacy issues when meeting with someone in his office. Pastor's seminary education is progressing nicely with approximately 2 years left. Pastor gave the Council permission to be in contact with the Seminary regarding his school and progress. Conflict resolution creation is underway and when Pastor gets a draft finished he will email to all council members for opinions/proofing. The flyers posted in church was revisited and Pastor agreed that if it is something new he will run it by council. If it is something the church has allowed before, it is fine to post. The issue of who covers for Pastor at hospitals when he is gone/not available was addressed. Pastor will inquire at Ministerial Association for direction.

Sandy volunteered to find out if anything special was to be done for new members on New Member Sunday. Deb motioned to approve Pastor's report. Steve seconded the motion and it carried.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT:

TREASURER'S/FINANCE REPORT: Deb explained that the church received information about donating to Samaritan's Purse. It was decided to pass that on to the Mission Board. Steve seconded and motion carried.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT: Tim reported the LW sign along Highway 15 needs painting, the entrance lights timer needs to be checked and he will be meeting with Dale Prisinger to check on the furnace for the fall/winter. Adam McMahon has resigned from the council. Deb motioned to approve property management report. Steve seconded it. Motion carried.

WORSHIP & EVANGELISM: Sandy reported that the Blessed Be Meals will be returning in September. Council agreed that the church will provide the containers. She also reported that since late July the Cancer Walk team has raised more than \$5,000 by being part of the drawings at the Wharf at Big Stone Lake. Rhonda Beckman has been to all of these drawings as a representation. The Corn Hole tournament is set for September at Living Word. Laurie motioned to approve worship and evangelism report. Moe seconded. Motion carried

**YOUTH & EDUCATION:** Laurie reported about purchasing playground equipment with funds that have been dedicated for youth. There was discussion and agreement to continue forward with the process of getting bids for dirt work and equipment. Sunday School will be starting on Rally Sunday, Sept. 7. During that church service the youth will be singing, the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will receive their Bibles, and the installation of Sunday School teachers will also be held. A potluck dinner will be held after church. There are 2 students who will be beginning first year Confirmation this year. Laurie and Sandy will be locating a month-long calendar at the entrance of kitchen. Laurie is ordering the calendar. Steve motioned to accept the youth and education report. Tim seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Any old business was covered in Pastor's report.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The money donations from Sunday morning coffee hours have been approximately \$300 and given to youth for many years. After discussion of a variety of areas, Sandy made a motion to have the money donations during the months of September & October to be used for the 2025 Live Nativity. Steve seconded. Motion carried. In October the issue will be revisited with additional options.

Discussion was prompted on the question of whether or not non-specified memorial donations (from funerals) should continue to automatically go into the general fund or not. It was suggested that we have a line item in our financials specifically for "Memorial money". It was also suggested that a "Wish List" of church needs could be composed. This would allow family members of the deceased to have a say in where they would like their memorial money to be used, if they have a preference.

**ADJOURNMENT:** Steve motioned the meeting be adjourned. Moe seconded. Motion carried. Jackie closed the meeting by leading us in praying the Lord's prayer.
