

or this year's mid-week
Advent meditations,
we will be using J.D.
Greear's **ADVENT** as a basis for
our time together. We will use
three sessions of a four-session
series meeting on December
3, 10, and 17. We will meet for
a light supper beginning at
5:15 and then move into the
sanctuary at 6:30 for a 30-minute
time together including the
singing of some of the favorite
carols of Christmas.

The focus of the study is on Jesus's identity and the significance of the Christmas story. The series uses names given to Jesus in Isaiah (Isaiah 9:6) to explore his roles as Emmanuel, Wonderful Counselor, Everlasting Father, and



more, emphasizing that the arrival of Jesus was a world-changing event rather than just a sentimental story.

The goal is to show how
knowing Jesus's true
identity changes everything
and how the gospel
provides a solution to

St. Lucia Breakfast

he women of our church and any others are invited to join us as we once again celebrate the joy of Christmas with our annual St. Lucia Breakfast on Saturday, December 13.

For over 20 years, the Swedish Covenant Church in the little town of Stockholm hosted a Swedish breakfast on the morning of December 13. The dining room in its little basement was beautifully decorated and filled with guests from all around the area who came to pause for an hour to prepare their hearts for Christmas. When the church members became a very small congregation, the yearly event ended.

Saint Lucia was an Italian saint, who gave her life for her faith when Christianity was spreading across the Roman Empire. The observance of her day began in Sweden and the immigrants brought it with them when coming to America. Held on December 13, the longest day of the year, it was a time to begin to prepare their hearts and homes for Christmas with the eldest daughter serving coffee and Swedish pastries to her family.

In 2008, the women of the American Lutheran Church decided that the Swedish tradition of the Covenant Church should be kept alive. With help from some of the elderly ladies in their congregation, the women learned how to make Swedish fruit soup and tea rings.

This is the 11th year the Women of Living Word have continued the custom of celebrating St. Lucia Day on the Saturday that falls closest to December

13. It is a time to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas. The event begins at 9:30 AM with coffee, Swedish pastries and fellowship. A short program follows with Christmas readings and the singing of Christmas carols. The event will be over by 10:30 AM. SUNDAY SCHOOL

Fences, Pigs, Needles, Roosters & Christmas Prep!

ovember was certainly a wildly wonderful month in Sunday School! We covered everything from lions to pigs, from threading needles to waking up with roosters — and even squeezed in some Christmas program practice. Here's a peek at what kept our kids busy (and our teachers on their toes!):

WEEK 1 – DANIEL IN THE LION'S DEN

We kicked off the month with Daniel and his unexpected overnight stay in a lion's den — definitely not on anyone's bucket list! The children learned how fences can keep things in or out, and how God's laws are like strong, loving barriers that keep us safe. Just as God shut the mouths of the lions to protect Daniel, His Word helps keep sin from sneaking in. A powerful reminder...

and thankfully no real lions

were present that morning.

WEEK 2 - PIGS & THE PRODIGAL SON

Next up: pigs! The children heard the parable of the lost son and learned what happens when someone trades wisdom for wild spending. The young man found himself broke, lonely, and sharing space with pigs — definitely not the deluxe suite he imagined. But when he returned home, his father welcomed him with open arms. To help remember God's forgiveness, the kids painted their own piggy banks. (And yes, some pigs now have eyelashes, superhero capes, and polka dots. Very biblical.)

WEEK 3 - THREADING THE NEEDLE

This week's object lesson proved that threading a needle is *very* difficult — especially with tiny fingers and lots of giggles. We talked about a young man in Scripture who loved God but loved his wealth even more. The children learned that nothing we own is more valuable than knowing Christ, and everything we have is a gift from Him. Even needles. Even patience.

WEEK 4 – ROOSTERS & WAKE-UP CALLS

We wrapped up our lessons with a noisy friend: the rooster! Kids learned how roosters help wake up the farm each morning, and how one rooster gave Peter a wake-up call of his own. Peter promised he would never leave Jesus, but Jesus knew Peter would deny Him three times before the rooster crowed. The children were reminded to keep their

eyes on Jesus — He gives us courage even when we feel scared or unsure.

WEEK 5 - CHRISTMAS PROGRAM PRACTICE

Our final Sunday was dedicated to Christmas program practice! The kids are excited to retell the story of Jesus' birth — with a special appearance from our True North VBS friends! here have been some comments made recently about the efforts of the cancer walk team and I'd like to try to clear some confusions up. The Living Word Warriors have a mission to fundraise all year in an effort to support

our local community and the surrounding community for those who are fighting cancer. The money that we fundraise is to benefit those who are affected. In order to receive funds from It Only Takes a Spark, there is an application to fill out and then submit to the core committee. This can be found on their website at www.takesaspark. org. Currently, there are about 95 people who are benefitting from funds through this organization. Due to this number, it is crucial that all the teams

are actively fundraising to provide funds to continue the support allocated to these individuals and their needs based on their treatment plans.

As a cancer walk team, we are required to pay a small fee, have a minimum of 8 members, fundraise yearly to support the cause, and participate in the annual cancer walk in June. The fundraising year is from August 1 through July 31. This year the Living Word Warriors thought it would be nice to do a 'big event' each guarter in an effort to raise funds. There is no overall goal in mind as this is our first full year

as a team, but there are goals within each event that we host. Last year we started late, in March, and were able to donate a little less than \$10,000 by the end of the fiscal year. This was amazing!! With that in mind, being able to double that number would be amazing for this year since we have 12 months

instead of 4.

With our efforts thus far, the cornhole tournament that was held in September allowed us to profit about \$360 and the Fall Bazaar held in November was a great success. We don't have a final profit number yet, but can roughly say \$2000. We are blessed to been given thus far. This mission is greater than me, you, or this team. It's for the community and the greater good of those who are battling a 24/7 sickness. Our mission is

We will be trying to finish out the year with sales of our ornaments, coffee cups, lefse, and baked goods. Again, thank you to everyone who has supported us and continues to support us. It is very humbling how our church family rallies together for our mission.

EMANUEL



DEAR CHURCH FAMILY OF LIVING WORD,

e are entering such a beautiful time of the year! Beginning with Thanksgiving Day, we start to turn our hearts to anticipation – the anticipation of, once again walking through Advent, preparing our hearts for the birth of the Savior at Christmas.

A few years ago, I was gifted a beautiful book by a dear friend. Its title is EMANUEL, by Ruth Chou Simons. In her writing, she offers an invitation to us to prepare room for Christ, not only at Christmas, but always. One of her writings is entitled, God's Promise. It is beautifully written and I would like to share it with all of you this Advent season. It reads...

The birth of Christ was not accident, surprise, or eleventh-hour rescue plan. It was God's promise all along. To think of Jesus as an after-thought to God's purposes and plans is to miss the wonder of the Redemption Story altogether — the opening chapter of which didn't take place at the manger, but in the heart of God from before time began.

How can we know that the Christmas story matters at all if we don't fully grasp our great need for a Savior? So many of us scurry about at Christmastime, hoping to find meaning in this season, when the true gift of the birth of Christ is found in unfathomable love in the heart of God. Try as we might, we can't muster up the feelings we want to feel at Christmas; we will experience the magnitude of Christmas only to the extent that we understand the grace and

mercy of God's plan of redemption. The uncertainty and fear Joseph must have felt at the news of Mary's pregnancy turned to assurance when the angel of the Lord revealed the divine fulfillment of God's promise and plan. Joseph's circumstances didn't change; he simply trusted God to do the impossible. God's spoken promise, kept, removes our greatest uncertainties.

In the same way our heart posture determines how we begin to prepare Him room this Christmas, the full picture of God's promise of salvation invites us to see clearly what we're really celebrating in this season – and why it matters today in the midst of our uncertainties and impossible circumstances.

So, this is a story of hope...a story of rescue. This is a story that turns the posture of our hearts from **me** to **He**. This is a story we keep telling day after day, season after season, year after year – even after the last ornament has been put away. This is God's promise to His people and to all who will come to Him as He comes to us.

It is my prayer that this message which holds all of the themes of Advent, Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, will come to you with special meaning as you prepare your hearts for Christmas knowing that the coming of the Christ Child was GOD'S GREATEST PROMISE TO YOU!

LWLC NOVEMBER 4 IMPACT MEETING MINUTES

ATTENDING: Vicki Strege, Sue DeJong, Gloria Cooley, Linda Anderson, Pastor Melanie, Marcia Heinje, Kelly Peterson

Opened with prayer by Pastor Melanie. Meeting called to order. Sue moved and Gloria seconded the motion to approve the minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Marcia read through the treasurer's report about what had been given through noisy change and through Impact for the year of 2025. Kelly said the youth fund has \$100,000 and does not need extra funding at this time. Scholarships also has about \$71,000. This money is invested. Marcia moved and Linda seconded the motion to file the treasurer's report. The total in the account for impact is \$6923.75.

OLD BUSINESS: Noisy Change for December was discussed. Sue moved and Linda seconded motion that Visiting Neighbors be the noisy change designation for December. Pastor Melanie will talk to Jan about putting the amount of noisy change donation in the bulletin each week. We will also try to get the noisy change designation in each newsletter.

NEW BUSINESS: Vicki talked to the school and there is a need for money for the lunch program and also needs of some students. Gloria moved and Marcia seconded the motion that we give \$500 to the lunch program at Milbank High School to be used for the students with the most needs and put the noisy change for January to give to Dan Snaza to use for student incidental needs at

Milbank High School. Motion carried.

Marcia moved and Gloria seconded the motion to give \$2000 to the education center in Cambodia. Motion carried.

An anonymous gift has been given to ALWM for \$2000 for the youth conference to be held in January in Cambodia and also the \$1700 needed for the motorcycle for traveling in Nairobi plus \$1300 toward the roof for the Maasai Church. Thanks were shown for this generosity.

Marcia moved to give \$700 to the roof on the Maasai Church at Makumira in Tanzania. Sue seconded the motion. Motion carried.

We listened to a video from Julie Smude who continues to work in Thailand even though she has been suffering from cancer. She has reached 4000 students since the terrible floods in northern Thailand. They have also suffered an earthquake. She thanked us for the prayers over the last two years. She says God's grace and our prayers have sustained her. We will discuss further funding for her when we meet again in January.

We will meet on January 6 at 10:00 AM.

Pastor Melanie discussed Filters of Hope. It is an economical way to provide clean water that lasts for 10 years. Vicki and Sue will see if this is something that Pastor Bill could use in Vietnam.

Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
