
"Blessed Be" Meals to be Offered Again

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Animals of the Bible

ur Sunday School children have been on quite an adventure – learning that God uses all kinds of creatures to teach us lessons about faith, obedience, and trust!

We started with the **quail**, who showed up in the desert when God's people were hungry and grumpy (we can all relate to that!). When the Israelites complained about having no food, God said, "I've got this," and sent **manna** and quail to fill their tummies. It was a good reminder that **God** provides for our needs, even when we don't see how.

Next, we met **Balaam's talking donkey**– yes, you read that right! Balaam was headed the wrong direction (literally and spiritually), and God used his trusty donkey and an angel roadblock to get his attention. The donkey had more sense than his rider that day! We learned it's always wise to do things God's way – and maybe to listen to your

pets once in a while, just in case.

Then we dove (or maybe got swallowed!) into the story of **Jonah and the big fish**. When Jonah tried

to run away from God's mission, he ended up in the world's first "submarine." After three days of fishy reflection, Jonah learned the importance of **obeying God** – the first time!

Finally, we learned about **Elijah and the ravens**. When Elijah was
hiding in the wilderness and feeling all
alone, God sent a flock of ravens to bring
him food. Talk about divine delivery service!
It reminded us that **God is always with us**, even when we feel like we're out in the
middle of nowhere.

From birds to fish to donkeys, we discovered that **God can use any creature to share His message** – and sometimes, He even uses kids like us!
