Rally Sunday & September Lessons Recap

Rally Sunday was a joyful beginning to our fall season! We started out with singing and creating a flower that shared something special about each child, which is now displayed in the church entry. The kids also enjoyed a Bible man video. During worship, our youth sang a lively song they learned at VBS and each received a special keychain reminding them to "walk with Jesus wherever they go." Our 3rd and 6th grade students also received their Bibles—a milestone in their faith journey.

This fall, our Sunday School lessons focus on **Animals in the Bible**:

Week 1 – The Snake & Temptation

We learned that temptation is real, and we have a choice—to give in or to follow God's way. The snake in the Garden wasn't evil itself (God created snakes!), but Satan used it to tempt Adam and Eve. To remember to follow God, the children created snakes of their own.

Week 2 – The Dove & God's Promise

Noah obeyed God's plan to build the ark, and after many days afloat, he sent out a dove to see if land was near. God kept His promise and gave a sign for all generations—the rainbow—that He would never again flood the whole earth. Rainbows after storms remind us of His faithfulness.

Week 3 – Frogs & God's Power

We learned about God's amazing power shown through the ten plagues in Egypt. Though Pharaoh's heart was hard, God's power had no limits and He freed His people from slavery. We are reminded that when God calls us to serve Him, nothing can stand against us.

September was full of joyful songs, meaningful lessons, and reminders of God's promises. We are excited to see what the rest of the fall will bring!





Dynamic Disciples - Fall Kickoff

The barn doors swung wide open for our first Dynamic Disciples gathering of the fall! We started the afternoon with hearty snacks (because no farmer works on an empty stomach), some toe-tappin' music, and plenty of time to renew friendships in our little "church family pasture."

Pastor's Letter

Psalm 38:4 "For my iniquities have overwhelmed me; they are a burden too heavy to bear"

Grace, Mercy, and Peace, be unto you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

When I was in college, I was a lifeguard during the summers. It was an easy job, didn't require much work except to remember to put on sunscreen, and it was a good way to exercise during breaks. Now, when God made me, buoyancy was not on His mind. Since I was little, I have sunk like a stone in water.

Passing the lifeguard test wasn't easy, but by the grace of God, I did pass the physical and written exams. I was all ready to bask in the sun and work my job of leisure all summer.....until my third day. The local pool had a 5ft diving board, a 10ft diving board, and included 10ft, 20ft, and 30ft platforms. Only crazy kids and professional divers ever ventured onto the 30ft platform until my third day. Right before we cleared the pool for a break and safety check, I watched as a person 3x my size scaled her way up to the 30 foot platform. When the whistles blew to clear the pool, she was still at the top, too afraid to jump down.

My boss turned to me and said "Simonson, go talk her down". Reluctantly, and with hundreds of people sitting and watching our every move, I reached the top and asked her what the problem was. Shaking in fear, she said "I can't do it, I need to climb down". Climbing down was not an option. It was far too dangerous, and at her size, it was impossible to climb down. So I said to her as I grabbed her hand. "Let's jump together okay"? She smiled and counted with me. (I had no intention of jumping with her, I would just let go when she jumped) On this day, God had other plans.

When we got to three, rather than jump alongside of me, the woman bear hugged me and jumped. I was now falling 30 feet underneath this large human who was squeezing me tight. We hit the water like a plane crashing into the ocean and my back hit the bottom of the 30 foot pool in less than a second. My back was burning as she placed both feet on my chest and pushed her way to the surface, causing any air in my lungs to flee. Only God knows how I survived. But it taught me a wonderful lesson.

Our sin, which grabs us and wants to take us into the abyss, can sting and knock the wind out of our lungs. But God will always pull us out of the depths and into His arms whenever we call on His name. He has paid for your sins, and they can no longer hold you down. We look at our lives and our sin and say "I can't do it". And God says "No, you can't, but I can, and I have already done it for you. Now go, and sin no more."

Live Free as both sinner and saint, in the promise of grace found only in Jesus Christ. Amen

A Message from our Council President

Hello everyone,

Fall is in full swing as we begin the month of October! It's been wonderful to see our kids back in Sunday School, several people in worship service, and to see so many people involved in various areas of the church. It reminds me of 1 Corinthians 12:12; The human body has many parts, but the parts make up one whole body. So it is with the body of Christ. All of us together are Christ's body, and each of YOU are a part of it. The more I have gotten involved in the church, and especially this last year while serving on Church Council, the more I am aware of just how many "parts" are within our church.

My intention for this letter is to give you a little background on just one of those many "parts" of the church. Last fall when we hired Pastor Curtis, the seminary suggested that we form a "Congregational Support Team" to help guide, mentor, and serve as a resource for him because he is still a student and we are his first church. This concept was a first for us as well, because we have not yet had a student pastor, so we asked the seminary to help us help him. They sent us a list of suggested expectations/objectives for such a support team. Some of the objectives included: provide constructive feedback on the student's preaching, teaching, pastoral care and leadership skills; work with the student to set short, medium and long term goals; be an advocate for the student regarding expectations and time requirements; be concerned with his whole life and making sure he is attentive to his personal and family needs. The guidelines for this group also included that the student pastor in training commits to: being aware of and honest about the multiple roles he has as a Pastor and a seminary student; working to balance the demands of those multiple roles; and that he encourages and seeks out feedback on his ministry and on progress of established goals.

A group of 4-5 congregational members, along with someone from the seminary, met with Pastor Curtis on a monthly basis in effort to be a resource for him according to these objectives. After several months there was a decision for the group to disban and the members unanimously agreed. It just wasn't serving its original purpose or effectively bearing fruit.

Since then, the Council has been taking a more active role in working with Pastor Curtis. In response to some concerns that were brought to our attention, we have developed a plan to work closely with Pastor Curtis in effort to support and mentor him. Part of that plan is to bring Pastor Melanie back on staff part time. We have also developed some guidelines that we feel will enhance his already well-liked ministry. We believe in Pastor Curtis, love him, and are so grateful for what he does bring to our church! He is "one part' of this body of Christ at Living Word Lutheran Church and together we are all unified on proclaiming the Gospel and glorifying God!
