SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS – PRESCHOOL EDITION

Preschool Sunday School kicked off the year by stepping into the exciting story of **David**, and it has already been full of fun, surprises, and a few tasty lessons!

Our first week started with a very important discovery: **M&M's might look like Skittles, but what's on the inside really matters!** That led us to a great lesson. God doesn't look at how we appear on the outside; He looks at our hearts. We made our own magnifying glasses and learned how God saw David's heart and chose him to be king. The kids quickly agreed that God has pretty amazing vision... much better than ours!

The next week, we learned how David was a faithful servant who used his musical gift to help King Saul. God gives each of us special gifts to serve others—and yes, we even got to play a *real harp!* Turns out preschoolers + harp = heavenly music (with a few creative notes mixed in).

We wrapped up January with the famous story of **David and Goliath**. The kids learned how little David trusted God and bravely faced a giant with just a sling and a stone. To test our own aim, we tossed beanbags to see if we could "hit the mark." Some throws were better than others, but everyone agreed—God can use even the smallest people to do big things!

Preschool Sunday School has been full of faith, fun, and fantastic stories—and we can't wait to see what God-sized adventures come next!

ELEMENTARY SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS – "OUR LOVE" CURRICULUM

Elementary Sunday School dove right into Our Love curriculum with a lesson that definitely caught everyone's attention—"**U Stink!**" We started by checking out candy hearts and reading the messages on them. While some were sweet, they also helped us talk about tough situations—like dealing with people who are mean or bully us. We learned that God calls us to forgive and not judge others... even though that can be really hard. The biggest takeaway? The one thing that truly changes hearts—ours and others—is **LOVE**.

The next week was "**Drive Me Cra-Z,**" and yes,

families were the star of the show. We talked about how family dynamics can sometimes drive us a little (or a lot!) crazy. God made families so we can learn how to live together, work through challenges, and appreciate each other's differences. We explored the story of **Joseph**, whose brothers treated him terribly—but God used that difficult situation for something much bigger and better. A great reminder that God is always at work, even in messy family moments.

We wrapped up the month with "**Feed Me,**" where candy hearts made another appearance—but with a twist. We noticed how messages have changed over time from simple "Love Me" and "Hug Me" to things like "Text Me." Many of them are focused on ME. That led to a meaningful conversation about how blessed we are and how God calls us to show compassion to others. Helping doesn't just mean giving money or meeting basic needs—it also means giving our **time**. And while giving time can feel scary or hard, it's one of the best ways to truly show God's love in action.

January challenged our hearts, stretched our thinking, and reminded us that love isn't just something we say—it's something we live.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS – GROWING IN FAITH

Our middle school students have been continuing their **Pre-Confirmation studies**, an important step in preparing them for Confirmation and for living out God's Word in their everyday lives. Through discussion, learning, and reflection, students are digging deeper into what it means to be part of God's family and to take ownership of their faith.

These classes help students connect Scripture to real-life situations—at school, at home, with friends, and in the choices they make each day. As they learn about God's promises, grace, and forgiveness, they are encouraged to ask questions, think critically, and grow in confidence as young Christians.

This time of learning is more than preparation for a milestone—it's about building a strong foundation of faith that will guide them now and in the years to come. We are grateful for their thoughtful participation and excited to watch them continue to grow in faith and understanding.

We wrapped up January by heading out into the “wilderness,” learning how Satan tried to tempt Jesus. Just like trail gear helps guide us through the wild, the Bible guides us through life. It prepares us, strengthens us, and shows us how to face challenges head-on—no compass required.

The Impact the World (ITW) meets every two months. Highlights of the January 7 meeting are as follows:

- **NOISY CHANGE** for December in the amount of \$410 was given to the Visiting Neighbors Program.

Done in the Name of Jesus

DEAR CHURCH FAMILY OF LIVING WORD,

They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eye. Then the Pharisees also began to ask him how he had received his sight. He said to them, "He put mud on my eyes. Then I washed, and now I see."

JOHN 9:13-14

Each morning as I approach the eye hospital entrance in Sierra Leone, I am greeted by this picture which has been a part of the building for over 30 years. The artist is a native Sierra Leonean who does free-hand pictures to bring Bible stories to life.

Along with this painting on the exterior wall of the building, inside I find dozens of people waiting for eye care — some suffering from injury, others nearly blind as a result of untreated glaucoma or retina problems, and so many who need cataract surgery. Their needs are unending. All of them come with a common story — they no longer


can function in the activities of their daily life due to their loss of vision. They come, the poorest of the poor, to a place of hope where eye care is provided without charge.

The teams who travel to the eye hospital offer care for approximately one hundred people during their one-week stay. Their most important message to the patients is to tell them the care they are receiving is done in the name of Jesus. The lives of these patients are changed forever, and the lives of the doctors rendering this care are, too, changed forever.

Those people who receive care return to their homes changed; changed in such a way that they can live on their own and share the news about the care that helped them overcome adversity. This story offers comfort because we see that God can and will work to bring good out of our challenges and suffering. God works for our good in all things and he has redeemed us in Christ. When the works

of God shine through adversity, he shows in such unique ways, his goodness and his love for all his people.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: Laurie made a motion to approve the agenda and Deb seconded. The motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Ash Wednesday is February 18. There will be communion. Pastor would like to see the confirmation class attend the Vining Retreat in Vining, MN, at the end of February. She will be looking into this. Pastor Melanie also suggested that we become more intentional with our evangelism and has some suggestions. TREASURER'S REPORT/FINANCE REPORT: No financial reports were reviewed as Kelly is gone. Laurie made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, and Sharon seconded. The motion carried.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT REPORT: Kyle reports there doesn't seem to be any issue by the sink area in the kitchen. The area was vacuumed out and that seems to have resolved the odor by the kitchen island. The water heater pressure relief valve was replaced and the water heater was flushed. The heart defibrillator pads/battery were updated. Tim replaced

the battery on the door lock and is keeping an eye on it to make sure it is operating properly. Julie made a motion to approve the Property Management report and Jackie seconded. The motion carried.

Members will be checking with sources to see who we could get to update/refresh our website. Council notebook will be reviewed by members and changes/updates brought to council at next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Shannon gave an update regarding the Call Committee. A motion was made to have the Impact Committee designate where our Lenten offerings will be used. Julie made a motion to approve and Sharon seconded the motion. The motion carried.
